Yes, TellicoLife imposes a \$0.50 convenience fee for making the payment, but that compares favorably to the expense of an envelope and postage for mailing it to the library, or to the \$0.54/mile expense of driving to the library. Also, it conserves volunteer time and energy handling check payments. The HOA is no longer accepting cash as payment.

The 2018 Orientations will be held at 6:30 pm at the Yacht Club on the following dates: March 29th, May 31st, July 31st, October 11th and November 29th.



Programs and General Meetings targeted to keep you Informed

You may have heard that 2018 is a big election year here in East Tennessee. I am just beginning to grasp how big that is and how important a voting block we are! I also recently learned that not uncommonly the candidate winning their primary elections here in East Tennessee goes onto win the November elections so voting in the primaries is critical.

HOA has decided to devote four meetings to introduce you to the candidates running for applicable offices up for reelection. These sessions are on:

March 15, 2018 from 4-6 PM at CCTV focused on Loudon County primary elections. There are 17 candidates running for the 10 offices up for reelection that directly govern the 37774 portions of Tellico Village.

April 2, 2018 from 6:30 - 9 PM at Kahite Community Center (Annex) focused on Monroe County primary elections. There are 21 candidates running for the 9 offices up for reelection that directly govern the 37885 portions of Tellico Village.

May 17, 2018 from 4-6 PM at CCTV focused on the TN State primary. Candidates have until April 5th to file;

there are already 13 candidates running for 4 offices.

June 28, 2018 from 4- 6 PM at CCTV focused on Federal offices representing TN. Candidates have until April 5^{th} to file; there are already 15 candidates running for 2 offices.

From either the HOA website (path of HOA Programs > General Meetings > applicable Town Hall Political Forum posting) or the Tellico Life calendar entry, you'll be able to view and print educational materials including who's running for each office, the bio of each candidate, the responsibilities of each office and when/where to vote.

A few weeks before the May 17th and June 28th event, you'll be able to enter suggested questions for candidates directly from the TellicoLife calendar entry.

These elections impact the future of our Village, so please join us.

Neighborhood Watch

Neighborhood Watch wants to remind all Tellico Village homeowners that 2018 is an important voting year as both Loudon and Monroe County Sheriff elections will be occurring. The office responsibilities of Sheriff include investigating criminal conduct, making arrests and executing civil and criminal court-ordered processes. In recent past, these offices have worked closely with HOA to establish our Neighborhood Watch and COPS program.

To help you be informed about the Sheriff candidates that are running, your HOA is sponsoring Town Hall meetings. The Loudon County Town Hall Political Forum was conducted on March 15 and presented the candidates running for Loudon County Sheriff. A similar forum will be held on April 2 in Kahite starting at 6:30 PM where you will hear the Monroe County Sheriff candidates in advance of Primary voting.

In addition to the Town Hall Political Forum, other important dates are below leading up to the Primary voting day.

- Monday, April 2nd, 2018 Last day to register to vote for the May 1st, 2018 County Primary
- Wednesday, April 11th, 2018 First day of early voting for the May 1st, 2018 County Primary
- Tuesday, April 24th, 2018 Last day to request and process an absentee ballot for the May 1st, 2018 County Primary
- Thursday, April 26th, 2018 Last day of early voting for the May 1st, 2018 County Primary
- Tuesday, May 1st, 2018 2018 Primary Voting Day
