

The Blue Book Is Being Updated

The Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions created the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) and authorize it to set rules, regulations and standards for the construction, maintenance and operation of buildings and other property within Tellico Village. The ACC has created the Residential Construction Handbook, otherwise known as the "Blue Book", for residential properties. The current edition was reviewed and approved by the POA Board on February 16, 2022 and went into effect on March 1, 2022.

The purpose of the Blue Book is to provide standards and processes for designing and building homes within Tellico Village. It is intended to:

- Provide a viable framework for the planning, design and construction of new homes, as well as confirmation of conformance with required standards and approvals.
- Accommodate permitted exterior modifications, alterations and enhancements for existing homes and contiguous property as may be requested in the future by resident property owners.

GAS STATION THEFTS

Thieves find ways of catching their victims by complete surprise when they are pumping gas or paying their tab inside the station. Most of the time gas station customers leave their car doors unlocked and items such as purses, wallets, backpacks and even the keys are left in plain view. A thief is able to drive up (or even walk up) to your car, open the unlocked door, and grab any valuables



within reach. Then he/she quickly leaves the area. It can happen in a matter of seconds, but these thefts can be prevented if you follow these tips to protect yourself from being a victim.

- Pick stations that are well-lit and have pump video surveillance cameras.
- Always remove your keys and lock the doors while you are pumping gas.
- Keep valuables out of plain view in your vehicle and lock the doors even if you are only going inside for a moment.
- Pay attention to your surroundings!
- Don't let your cell phone distract you.

Good Shepherd Donation Saves on Taxes



If you are considering charitable giving during the year, you should speak with your CPA regarding using the "Qualified Charitable Deduction" rule to save on potential taxes. The Donor Advised Fund program is also a program you can use to make donations. If you are 72 and above, you may have RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) issues with your IRA/SEP plans. You can donate your RMD values directly to the Good Shepherd-up to \$100,000- and not count that donation or money as taxable income!

The Good Shepherd Center has recently set up a "Brokerage Account" to make it easy to transfer assets from a person's account directly to the Good Shepherd. Instead of simply sending cash or checks to the Good Shepherd Center individuals have multiple options.
