HOA ADVOCACY NEWS

Tellico Village Plays a Part in Loudon County's Strategic Plans



Every resident knows that East Tennessee is a destination homestead that is growing very rapidly. The Loudon County Economic Development Agency (LCEDA) commissioned an economic strategic plan in 2022 because of rapid growth in the county. The County noted that they did not have adequate planning policies and a plan was needed. The county's actions at that time were limited to establishing a moratorium on planned unit developments (PUDs) and enacting a minimum density of residential development to two units per acre. The new strategic plan addresses growth factors that impact both the county and

its municipalities in effort to create an economic development vision for the community that is sustainable. The resulting plan assesses current marketing conditions and includes recommendations for promoting smart growth and enhancing the quality of life in the county and its municipalities.

The plan was developed with stakeholders and municipal leadership input, business and citizenry surveys, and a comprehensive market analysis. The citizens survey, run from June 3 to July 29, 2022, was open to all County residents, however, it was not well publicized in Tellico Village and only 27 of the respondents to the survey reported that they lived in Tellico Village.

Still, Tellico Village is a significant part of the Loudon County Strategic Plan and was mentioned 25 times. Some of the mentions in the plan include:

- Tellico Village is a place to visit.
- Tellico Village is fast becoming the largest community in the county. Loudon County grew by nearly 16% in the past 12 years. Tellico Village, the third largest community in the county, grew by nearly twice that (31.3%) while the largest community, Loudon grew 19.8% and the second largest, Lenoir City grew 21.4%.
- Tellico Village has the highest growth rate in county.
