

HOA Event Registration

Hey Honey! Did you register us for Singo? I thought you did but I don't remember. When this conversation comes up about any HOA event, the next thought you have is to send an email to the Event Coordinator and ask, "Did we sign up for Singo?" While this is a normal question and we get it a lot, I am going to give you two simple, easy ways to figure this out before you reach out to the EC. Anytime you register for an event, you will receive a confirmation email. It is always best to hold on to

these emails until the event passes. If you need to cancel prior to the cancellation date for some reason, there is a 5-digit code in the email that we will need to process the refund.

If you can't find your email, on the event page in Tellico Life, down towards the bottom left of the screen is a computer monitor. It is right below the "Sign Up Here" button on every event. If you click on that monitor, you will find a list of everyone that is signed up for the event. The majority of the time, if you send us an email, this is where we are going to go to find out if you sign up.


HOA Litter Angels


WELCOME ORIENTATION MEETING


