July 2023 President's Message:

When I first moved here, I was told that "Tellico Village is run by volunteers". I thought that was an odd comment, since the POA is staffed by hard working people who provide many important services to the village. If Tellico Village is run by volunteers, then what's the purpose of the professional staff? In reality, it's a partnership of professional staff and resident volunteers working together to ensure the success of our community.

HOA is entirely run by volunteers. Thankfully, since HOA isn't responsible for keeping the sewers working, paving the roads, or maintaining our amenities, it can be run by volunteers. There are no paid staff members supporting HOA (other than an occasional kind assist from the POA – thank you POA!), which keeps our costs low and the resulting annual dues also low. The HOA Board, committees (A&E, Litter Angels, Neighborhood Watch, Highway Safety), Event Coordinators, and many other people provide the services that keep HOA running.

We're at that time in the year to begin preparing to fill 2024 HOA positions. Per our Bylaws, there is a specific process to follow:

"The HOA Board shall appoint a Nominating Committee no later than July 15. The Nominating Committee shall consist of two HOA Board officers, one of whom shall serve as chair, and a maximum of three representatives from the membership at large."

"The Nominating Committee shall identify at least one candidate for each elected office and standing committee position and shall ensure that the nominee is willing to serve if elected. The committee shall solicit names of candidates from HOA Board members as well as from the HOA membership. In the interest of continuity, the Committee's nominee for President should be chosen from the Executive Council."

"At the October Board meeting, the Committee shall present for approval the slate to be voted on at the November Special Meeting or electronically."

Our first step is to form a Nominating Committee, which needs to be approved by the HOA Board at our July 10 meeting. I need your help with this. Would you please consider being a member of the Nominating Committee? It's a short-term task (usually August through October) and the meeting times are flexible. It's up to the committee to decide when and how to meet. Your input will help to shape next year's HOA Board and all the other positions in HOA. It's a critical activity to ensure the future success of HOA.

I also need you to consider volunteering for a position in HOA. We need village residents like you to fill roles on the Board, committees, and support teams. The only requirements are to be an HOA member and a desire to help our Tellico Village community. If you're interested and/or want to ask questions about this, please let me know (or any HOA Board member). Contact us here.

HOA Advocacy Update

POA to Consider Changes to Tellico Village Governing Documents

The POA will be considering changes to several documents that govern how Tellico Village is run and some of the things that residents can do within the Village. The documents are the:

- "Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions, Tellico Village, Tennessee." This is the overarching constitution of our community that describes membership in the Village, development of common property, water and sewage systems, roads and all other amenities, establishes the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) and allows the POA to set standards for Village properties and their maintenance. The document was developed by Cooper Homes, the original developer of Tellico Village and gave them certain developer rights. Since the purchase of the Cooper properties, these developer rights have conveyed to its successor, our POA.
- "Protective Covenants Exhibit I to the Declaration." This is an attachment to the "Declaration" and is subordinate to it. It provides specific requirements and restrictions including zoning, temporary structures and outbuildings, subdividing lots, prohibition of septic tanks and wells, screening, signs, businesses, livestock, mines and oil wells. It also defines the specific duties and responsibilities of the ACC.
- "Residential Construction Handbook" commonly known as the Blue Book. The "Protective Covenants" require the ACC to develop it and the TVPOA to approve it. This includes the rules, regulations and standards established by the ACC and approved by the TVPOA. It describes how the ACC will operate and issue permits. It also defines site and construction standards, builder construction requirements, property maintenance standards and enforcement standards. Its fundamental purpose is to:
 - o preserve and maintain the environment of the community of Tellico Village and the ambiance and character of its neighborhoods and homes.
 - o protect and enhance property values throughout Tellico Village.
 - o contribute to the continuation of the inherent and natural attributes of Tellico Village as a highly desirable community in which to live.
