Message from the HOA President

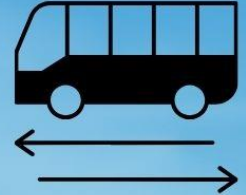

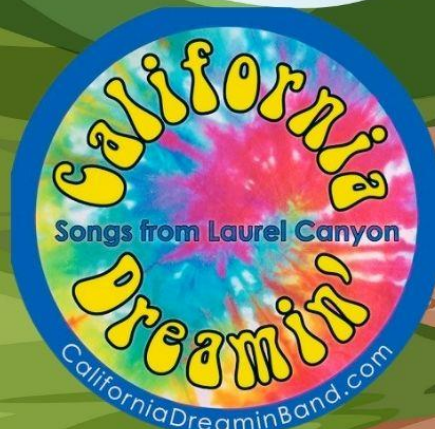
